## 1. "Jingle Bells" was the first song played in space.

The crew of NASA's *Gemini 6A* space flight played "Jingle Bells" on December 16, 1965, making it the first song played in space.



2. If you received all the gifts in the song "Twelve Days of Christmas" you would receive 364 items!



3. The Statue of Liberty is officially the largest Christmas present in the world.

It was given to the US by France in 1886. It stands over 150 feet tall and weighs 225 tons.



4. We know Thomas Edison created the light bulb, but he was also involved with creating the first Christmas lights.

According to the Library of Congress, Edison created the light strand in 1880 and hung it outside his Meno Park, NJ lab during Christmas. His partner, Johnson, in 1882, became the first to wrap a strand of hand-wired red, white, and blue bulbs around a Christmas tree.



5. The Christmas Tree in Rockefeller Center is decorated each year with over 25,000 lights!

This is a far cry from the first tree left there in 1931 with no lights or ornaments or decorations. Two years later, the Christmas tree was erected and fully decorated.



**6.** An unusual Christmas classic, *Home Alone* is the highest-grossing Christmas movie in the US of all time!

This 1990's film launch child star Macaulay Culkin into fame and made this movie an almost-instant classic. It is a seasonal and traditional favorite for families around the world.




## 7. Looking for a home-grown tree this year? Christmas trees are grown in all 50 states!
